Ever since its first appearance in Raiders of the Lost Ark, the *Raiders March* has been such a recognizable symbol of Indiana Jones that we associate it with the character as much as we do his trademark bullwhip and fedora. And like other John Williams themes, it's not just that the theme represents the character, but that it does so in such an appropriate way that it would be hard to imagine something different working this well. In large part, this is because of Williams' remarkable ability to coordinate many different parameters of the music with various facets of the thing it represents, in this case, Indy himself. *Program notes by Mark Richards* 

Gary Fagan is a master of writing novelty pieces. His works are always appropriately scored for young band. *Clarinets Packing Up Early* shows the audience that the clarinet still plays well when not fully assembled. Oh, and don't ever make a section of clarinets mad at you...

This sweeping, romantic, and emotionally uplifting soundtrack is one of the best motion picture scores of all time. It won composer John Williams his 12th and 13th Grammy Awards and his fourth Oscar.

Writer Melissa Mathison's story is about Elliott, a boy emotionally scarred since his father deserted him and his family for a new girlfriend. He is now an angry loner, not risking forming any relationship. Then he meets an extra-terrestrial scientist accidentally stranded on Earth. At first E.T. is a safe object of Elliott's interest, being a "creature," not a human, and treated by Elliott and his siblings as a toy or pet. But when presumably ill-intentioned government UFO investigators come on the scene, Elliott chooses to try to save E.T., risking emotional commitment, and even rejoining the society of his fellow kids to enlist them in his cause. He also helps E.T. contact his shipmates, resulting in E.T. having to leave Elliott behind, but now Elliott has the emotional strength to accept this new separation.

Williams' musical palette is very wide: Slithering string portamenti recall Close Encounters of the Third Kind, but parallel fifths and organ pedal transform the effect into a nearly religious sound.

The spirited high-jinks of the children, the warm music that develops as Elliott and E.T. bond, and an exultant action motif with a peculiar skip in its rhythm all grow in importance. Then they coalesce to form the exultant "Flying Theme," the emotional pay-off of the film.

Notes by Joseph Stevenson

Everyone has experienced defining moments where they have been faced with what seemed to be insurmountable challenges. We are often defined by how we succumbed to the challenge or rose to meet it. Inner strength and spirit powers us to triumph over all who might seek to test us or divert us from our desired path. Teachers know that many of these triumphs go unrecognized, but can have a significant and resounding impact on our students, community, and ourselves. *Triumphs!* is a symbolic work that serves to celebrate these successes that occur every day in every walk of life.

#### "Wild Horses of Schackelford Banks"

"Wild horses have been found on the barrier islands of Georgia, the Carolinas, and Virginia since the early explorers first visited the continent. Some of the horses swam to shore as a result of shipwrecks. Others perhaps got free from, or were abandoned by early settlers moving inward.

These hardy souls have withstood storm and tempest, and in a few cases they have survived the incursion of modern man.

In 1998, the horses on Shackelford Banks, an uninhabited island in the outer banks of North Carolina, were going to be moved elsewhere. However, many people gathered up enough support for the horses to stay and be protected. These Mustangs proudly remain and flourish to this day."
